“Do You Sing Twinkle” By Sandra Levins

This answers little-kid questions about not only new stepparents but also new siblings, too.

“The Invisible String” By Patrice Karst

For kids who go between homes, this sends the message that they can feel connected to their parents regardless of whose house they are in.

“Bigger Than a Bread Box” By Laurel Snyder

A powerful novel about 12-year-old Rebecca, who moves with her mom to her grandmother’s house after her parents’ divorce. A magic bread box that grants wishes makes things better – but more complicated.

“The Sisterhood of the Traveling Pants” By Ann Brashares

“Though mostly a story about the power of women and friendship, there is a really relatable portrayal of one character’s parents’ divorce and her visiting her dad who is getting remarried. Her despondence is captured perfectly,” says Cora Collette Breuner.
